
Relax and enjoy our scheduled flight from Houston to Madrid, Spain

DAY 2 Thursday, 27 June 2019



- Our private coach will be waiting to transfer us to our hotel in Madrid.
- Our centrally-located Madrid hotel will be our home for the next two nights. We will have breakfast at the hotel daily.
- Spain's capital city of Madrid lies at the heart of the country. Despite its modern and cosmopolitan culture, the city has preserved its traditional architecture and charm. This is a city of great monuments and great art, all against the backdrop of a rich culture and an exciting nightlife.
- In Madrid, the cost of public transport is included for all group sightseeing. Escorted by our Tour Director, we will be able to experience the city in the same manner as the local people.
- We will participate in an orientation session, covering Health and Safety aspects of the week

DAY 3 Friday, 28 June 2019



- Walk through the Plaza de España. In the center of the square we will see the monument to Cervantes, which depicts characters from his most famous work, Don Quixote. We will also see a monument to Columbus.
- View the Palacio Real, a huge palace begun in 1738 on the site of the Madrid Alcázar, which burned to the ground in 1734. Our tour will take us through some of the palace's 2,000 rooms that the "enlightened despot" Charles III called home. Although the palace is no longer home to the royal family, it is still full of art treasures and antiques, including Tiepolo ceilings and paintings by Goya. Highlights of our visit include the Reception Room and State Apartments; the Throne Room; the Banquet Room, where receptions for heads of state are still held; and the Royal Chapel.
- Spend time in the Plaza Mayor, Madrid's most famous square. Throughout its long history the square has hosted markets, bullfights, soccer games, public executions, and the Spanish Inquisition. It is now ringed by shops and cafés and is often filled with artists and musicians.
- Explore the Prado, one of the world's finest art museums. Inside is a collection of European art from the 12th to 19th centuries based on the Spanish Royal Collection. Our specialist guided tour will focus on the Spanish masters, such as Velazquez, Goya, and El Greco; and we will also see works by Raphael, van der Weyden, Bosch, Rubens, Titian, and Caravaggio.

















DAY 3 Friday, 28 June 2019



Dinner this evening will be arranged at El Botin (reservation only).

DAY 4 Saturday, 29 June 2019

We will have use of a private coach and driver, while touring for the next two days.

Our base for the night will be Toledo (area), where breakfast and dinner will be provided at the hotel.

The historic city of Toledo, capital of La Mancha, is a cultural fusion of Christian, Arab, and Jewish traditions from the Middle Ages. With numerous churches, museums, mosques, synagogues, and artistic treasures, the city has definitely earned its World Heritage Site designation.

Enjoy a Walking Tour of central Toledo, with streets barely wide enough for a man and his donkey. During our walk, there will be the opportunity to visit spectacular shops that produce and sell Damascene gold jewelry, as well as medieval swords. There will also be some time to relax in the Plaza de Zocodover, a bustling triangular square in the heart of Toledo.

Walk to Toledo Cathedral, considered one of the greatest Gothic structures in Spain. The cathedral actually reflects several architectural styles, and features many art treasures, including: the Transparente, a Last Supper in alabaster, El Greco's Twelve Apostles and Spoliation of Christ, Goya's Arrest of Christ on the Mount of Olives, and works by Juan de Borgona. The Treasure Room features a 500-pound, 15th-century gilded monstrance, allegedly made with gold brought back from the New World by Columbus, which is still carried through the streets of Toledo during the feast of Corpus Christi.

DAY 5 Sunday, 30 June 2019

We will continue on to our host families in Salamanca.

Our home for the next five evenings will be with our homestay families in Salamanca, where three meals will be provided daily.

The university city of Salamanca is one of the friendliest cities in Spain. It is known as the heart of the Castillian language, the purest form of Spanish, and visitors can enjoy practicing their skills while exploring the city's unique architecture.

We will have an orientation meeting to provide students with relevant information and useful tools to familiarize them with their host country and the program ahead.

DAY 6 Monday, 01 July 2019

This morning, participate in Spanish Language and Culture classes.

Take a Walking Tour through the city center, beginning at the Convento de Santa Ursula. Our walk will take us past the Monument to Unamuno and the Casa de las Conchas, before continuing into the Plaza Mayor, one of Spain's largest and grandest squares.





DAY 7 Tuesday, 02 July 2019

This morning, participate in Spanish Language and Culture classes.

Explore the Catedral Vieja and the Catedral Nueva. Unusually, the two cathedrals are built side-by-side and offer a contrast in styles, ranging from Baroque to Romanesque to Renaissance. In the Old Cathedral, a 53-panel altarpiece painted by Nicolas Florentino frames the statue of Salamanca's patron saint, the 12th century Virgen de la Vega. After departing the cathedrals, our walk continues through Salamanca's old quarter to the 1st century Puente Romano, the Convento de las Duenas, the Iglesia-Convento de San Esteban, and the magnificent Torre del Clavero.

Learn how to dance Flamenco from local dancers in a lesson this afternoon.

DAY 9 Thursday, 04 July 2019

This morning, participate in Spanish Language and Culture classes.

Today we will take part in service activities in the local area.

DAY 10 Friday, 05 July 2019

This morning, participate in Spanish Language and Culture classes.

We will have use of a private coach and driver, while touring for the next three days.

We will continue to Santander (area), our base for the next two nights. Breakfast will be included at the hotel.

Santander is the capital city of the Cantabria region on Spain's north coast. The Palacio de la Magdalena, once the royal summer residence, lies at the mouth of the Bay of Santander on the rocky La Magdalena Peninsula. West, the city center is home to the Catedral de Santander, with its octagonal cupola and Gothic cloister. Nearby, the Paseo de Pereda promenade runs along one side of the Jardines de Pereda gardens.

DAY 11 Saturday, 06 July 2019

We will take a walking tour around Santander. The Palacio de la Magdalena, once the royal summer residence, lies at the mouth of the Bay of Santander on the rocky La Magdalena Peninsula. West, the city center is home to the Catedral de Santander, with its octagonal cupola and Gothic cloister. Nearby, the Paseo de Pereda promenade runs along one side of the Jardines de Pereda gardens.

The Palacio de la Magdalena is a palace located on the Magdalena Peninsula. It was built between 1909 and 1911, by popular subscription, to house the Spanish Royal Family during the summer

Today, we will spend time at one of Santander's beautiful beaches, where we will have the opportunity to learn how to surf.

DAY 12 Sunday, 07 July 2019

- (2) We will return to our host families in Salamanaca. On the way, we will stop in Comillas.
- Tour the Cave of Altamira, which is renowned for its numerous parietal cave paintings featuring charcoal drawings and polychrome paintings of contemporary local fauna and human hands, created during the Upper Paleolithic. The earliest paintings in the cave were executed around 35,500 years ago.
- Take a walking tour of the town of Comillas. Comillas was the capital of Spain for a day, the 6th of August 1881, following an agreement between king Alfonso XII and the Minister's Council to gather at a formal meeting in town. Its Modernista architecture includes 19th century El Capricho, a Gaudí-designed chalet. Nearby, elaborate, Neo-Gothic Sobrellano Palace has Gaudí furniture.
- Our home for the next five evenings will be with our homestay families in Salamanca, where three meals will be provided daily.

DAY 13 Monday, 08 July 2019

- This morning, participate in Spanish Language and Culture classes.
- Today, we will participate in a cooking class, where we will be able to learn more about traditional Spanish cuisine.

DAY 14 Tuesday, 09 July 2019

- This morning, participate in Spanish Language and Culture classes.
- Explore the Rio de Tormes, the river that runs through Salamanca, on paddle boats.

DAY 15 Wednesday, 10 July 2019

- This morning, participate in Spanish Language and Culture classes.
- We will have the afternoon to play one of Spain's favorite sports, soccer!

DAY 16 Thursday, 11 July 2019

- This morning, participate in Spanish Language and Culture classes.
- Tonight we will have a special Farewell Dinner in a local restaurant to bring closure to your experience.

DAY 17 Friday, 12 July 2019

- This morning, participate in Spanish Language and Culture classes.
- The afternoon is free to explore the city and to pack before the overnight drive to Madrid.
- We will have use of a private coach and driver, while touring for the next one day. Arrive home.
